After the loss the day before, the team were eager to redeem themselves. After losing the toss, High were sent in to bat on what looked like a good batting pitch. Aditya and Allen opened the batting well before Allen was bowled for 5 and Aditya followed soon after. Ned and Jesse begun a good partnership before Jesse was unfortunately caught behind off an extremely unlucky ball that appeared to hit a crack. Tushaar soon came to the crease and together with Ned, they began rebuilding the innings. Both patience and determination were displayed by both batsmen as the partnership reached 69 runs with Ned having scored a half-century. Tushaar was then unluckily caught off an amazing catch in the deep for 33. Sagar then came in and showed that his partnership with Ned had potential but unfortunately ended prematurely as Ned was run out for 53. A good partnership of 47 ensued between Sagar and John with Sagar ending up on 37 and John 18. High batted out the remaining overs to finish on 176.

Defending 176 on a cracking pitch seemed achievable and High was on the right track early as above-par opening spells from aditya and lasith were finally rewarded with an early wicket. But then extremely tight, line and length spells from Barry and Tushaar but the stops on Melbourne high with a required run rate moving from 3.9 to above 5 an over. but then a lapse fielding and bowling standards let the get away, even described at times as "disgusting". George was an unlikely hero in a chase that was getting almost too easy for Melbourne; his spell with some deceptive meds returning him great figures of 5/29 from 7 overs. With only 6 overs to go Melbourne needed 30 to win; Barry was unable to bowl late in the day due to a back injury which put more stress on the other quicks. Lasith bowled well (1/31 from 7) and with 12 needed off 3 the pressure was on. Having bowled 9 economical overs for only 24 runs Tushaar was keen for the task of defending 4 but then confusion struck as it was realised the maximum overs were 9, an edge through slips first ball of Aditya's over brought the game to an agonising end.

High won the toss and elected to bat on a pitch ripe for batting. Our openers Aditya and Lasith got off to a solid start but both undid their good work after being bowled from playing premeditating shots. Jesse was caught behind off a great seaming delivery, leaving High at 3/26. Ned and Tushaar managed to recover the innings until drinks. Sagar came to the crease and resurrected the innings with Ned but just as they seemed to wrestle the momentum back from Melbourne a horrible mix-up resulted in Sagar being run out. Ned continued on past 50, playing some magnificent shots off their spinners. Unfortunately just a couple of overs later Ned got a leading edge and was caught and bowled. The tail failed to wag, losing the last 5 wickets for 5 runs to be all out for 108.

High went into the field knowing that early wickets were key to how the game would end up. Unfortunately Melbourne got off to a good start, leaving High on the backfoot until another horrible mix-up led to Melbourne losing their first wicket. A good period of line and length bowling resulted in Tushaar picking up the second wicket and suddenly High were back in the game. Small partnerships of between 10-20 frustrated High as they couldn't manage to build any pressure between dismissals. Another run out let High back into the game, with Melbourne needing 17 runs with 4 wickets in hand. Unfortunately the remaining batsmen managed to play some smart shots and with some assistance from our numerous sundries, passed the total with 3 wickets in hand. The 25 runs we gave away in wides, no-balls and misfields proved to be the difference, with Melbourne fielding excellently and managing to bowl only one wide.

7 December 2012

Eager for our best finish in 19 years the anticipation grew as Agnish Nayak won his first toss as captain and elected to bat on an even pitch. Visakan and Ned started steadily to be without loss after 6 overs. Chaos struck as High were suddenly 4/21, exposing a young middle order to the new ball. A small partnership of 31 between Thilan and Tushaar took High to drinks and some stability. Agnish then came to the crease after Thilan was caught at first slip, and played positively against the spinners. Tushaar looked to be the rock of the side in his mammoth knock compromising 83 balls, but was eventually caught playing the pull shot. High had to come out firing as 94 was never going to be easily defended. Ani Ramesh assisted by Owen Duffy put the plug on a quick start by having Adelaide 2/2. But some sensible batting took Adelaide past the score in the 37th over, 4 down, despite the efforts of the High bowlers.

High consolidated on a good start from the top order by batting the full overs in tough conditions. Owen Duffy continued his all-round form in the tournament by anchoring the innings with a useful 54. Thilan Subasinghe featured in a 58 run stand, with Duffy, as he found some form and played his picturesque late-cut on many occasions to the delight of the high crowd. With some more runs to defend this time round Ani Ramesh delivered, with a fiery spell with included multiple chances and had the crowd on edge leaving Melbourne reeling at 2/31 after 16. Shiv bowled beautifully, varying his flight and pace superbly to finish with 3/15 off 10 overs (an economy of 1.50). Ably supported at the other end by Chris Mao, Aditya Koneru and Anup Kaluve whom kept the run-rate down. A partnership of 68 took them with in reach despite being 8 down. Coming back for his 2nd spell, Tushaar's death bowling was once again cherished as he captured another wicket as did Ani from the other end, setting up a last over win.

High started poorly due to a combination of poor shots selection and atrocious running as Kent St looked to make the most of a nippy McKay wicket. However, thanks to a perfect combination of aggression and tidy running from Shiv he built partnerships with the lower order and was the rock of the innings, bringing up the 50 with his signature cut-shot. Defending a below-par total High came out firing as Owen Duffy took 2 wickets in his first two overs. Ably supported by Anirudh Ramesh from the other end, who was unlucky not to get a couple more, and Shiv, High continued to attack. Coming on for his 2nd spell Owen took 3 more to wrap up the innings as High dismissed Kent St for 66. With a combination of fast bowling (2 overs) and off-spin (3 overs) Owen broke his brother Joey Duffy's record (5/22) of the best figures in the tournament by a Sydney High player by capturing 5/17.
