<u>2011/12 – 14's Results</u>

14 A's

25th February & 3rd March 2012

14A's - High 176 (59) (K.Subbanna 37, R.Hossain 28*, T.Nimac 27, F.Morshedi 16, S.Nampalli 14) drew with **Grammar 0**/7 (4)

After winning the toss and electing to bat, High got off to a shaky start, losing their first wicket in only the 3rd over. Unfortunately Shashank was also dismissed just before drinks after he and Thomas were beginning to steady the innings. A great partnership between Thomas and Karthik which nearly lasted the whole 2nd hour placed High in a strong position. Their 65 run partnership lasted 17 overs. A mini collapse of 5/16 however saw High in major trouble and sink to 7/119 after 42. A great fight back by Raphin and the tail made sure High did not capitulate but survive another 17 overs and add a vital 57 more runs to the total. Day 2 Washed Out.

18 February 2012

14A's - High 7/171dec. (57) (K.Subbanna 52, E.Hall 51, J.Pope 40) drew with Newington 4/162 (24) (P.Yu 3/23 [7])

HIGH began Day Two confidently with James continuing from where he left off, taking the team total past 50. However the fall of two quick wickets saw HIGH slump to 3/56. Karthik and Eli were able to rescue the innings and produce one of the season's most memorable partnerships. The pair batted for 31 overs and compiled 106 runs. Soon after drinks, Karthik reached his maiden half century for HIGH with a 6 and was shortly joined by Eli who also hit a 50, his second for the season.

A declaration was eventually made with one and a half hours remaining in the day to bowl out Newington. HIGH full of confidence after a brilliant batting innings got off to great start with the ball as Peter claimed a caught behind dismissal in only the 3rd over of the innings. HIGH however were unable to make further inroads as the Newington batsman began to dominate. Eli and Karthik steadied the ship and batted through most of the innings before Eli tried to hit out. A final surge meant that we scored more than 2/3 of our runs in the 2nd half.

19 November 2011

12 November 2011

14 A's - High 47 (30) (S. Nampalli 17*) vs. Shore 2/139 (34) (T. Nimac 1/20 [6], J. Pope 1/35 [6])

High got off to a shocking start, sinking to 3/10 from 12 overs. Things just kept going down hill with Eli being run out by a fantastic direct hit. Shashank batting at 4 was the only batsman to show consistent application and was not out at the end. The fielding was not much better with dropped catches, misfields and no energy. A much stronger batting effort is required by High next week to avoid an outright innings defeat.

5 November 2011
