Then Kevin Ke deceived Joeys star batsman with an excellent ball and Karthik took his first stumping of the year. Another wicket from Kevin Ke in his 3rd over and High were beginning to look on top. Far from ideal conditions greeted the 15Bs as they arrived at the picturesque Moore Park West last Saturday. The field was thoroughly soaked after a significant deluge over night, and resembled the Gold Coast's "Wet n' Wild" theme park more than a Cricket field. Nonetheless, the team, having won the toss, elected to bat first in order to make the Shore bowlers battle with the soap-like ball. Despite the early loss of Kabir, Lashan and Supan formed a strong partnership to drive the total steadily forward. The large boundaries at Moore Park West meant aggressive running between the wickets was required, with the 15Bs putting on an excellent display.

The 15B team was upbeat as they arrived at Newington's resplendent grounds on Saturday, and soon sought to reflect the relative luxuriousness of their surroundings in their style of play. Losing the toss, the team was put in the field by a confident Newington team. This confidence soon evaporated with early pressure by opening bowler Kabir being rewarded with a first over wicket. In tandem with fellow speed demon and opening bowler Salil, the pair delivered a tight and devastating opening barrage on the Newington order. The quality of bowling did not dissipate with the introduction of the change bowlers. In particular, Aashray and Rick provided more than steady mid-innings bowling that further depleted the Newington cause. With the loss of the valiant Kabir, captain Rick made a commanding journey to the crease. Despite the loss of the wicket, High's momentum only continued to increase from here, with Lashan launching a veritable blitzkrieg on the Newington attack including 9 fours on his way to a compelling half century. Rick contributed well to the cause with some blistering stroke play and thoughtful exchanges of the strike. High's ultimate victory in the 15th over by a convincing 9 wicket margin more than adequately reflected the team's dominance over Newington throughout the day's play.

1 December 2012

**15 B's - HIGH 150 (32)** (K. Agrawal 24, R. Saha 24, A. Narula 22) defeated by **St Joseph's 5/151 (25)** (K. Agrawal 2/3 [6])

24 November 2012

**15 B's - HIGH 39 (25)** (D. Fu 9, G. Ou 6\*) defeated by **Shore 2/40 (10)** (K. Agrawal 2/0 [4])

On an overcast day, High lost the toss and was sent in to bat on a green, seaming wicket. A strong Shore pace attack and difficult conditions saw our top order being dismantled, as we reached 5-9 in the fifth over. However, the lower order showed fighting spirit in spending time at the crease and stringing together valuable runs. Denny Fu (9) and Hayden Ou (6 not out) in particular made useful contributions as High was eventually bowled out for 39 in the 25th over. A stirring opening spell by Kabir Agrawal of four overs, four maidens and two wickets gave High hope of a miraculous victory. Unfortunately, it was not to be, as Shore knocked off the winning runs at the end of the tenth over, capping off a difficult day for High.

17 November 2012

High won the toss and batted first, and after a decent start lost a few quick wickets to be at 2-30 after nine overs. A solid 38 run partnership between Shreyas Pulapaka (22) and Rick Saha (50) steadied the team, setting a good platform before Shreyas was dismissed, leaving High at 3-69 at the halfway point. Sensible batting and good rotation of the strike saw High build further with a 55 run partnership between Rick and Supan Arudselvan (14 not out). With cameo contributions from Kabir Agrawal (12) and Aashray Narula (10 not out), High reached set a strong total of 141. A probing opening spell from Kabir Agrawal and Manil Abeysekera saw Scots struggling at 0-14 after 8 overs; however some untidy bowling let Scots off the hook as they reached 2-79 after 18 overs.

Quick wickets had High on top again with Scots under pressure at 5-85. Unfortunately poor fielding and multiple dropped catches ultimately cost High the game as Scots scored the winning runs in a thrilling finish with 4 balls to spare. 10 November 2012

On an overcast day, High won the toss and sent Grammar in to bat. Kabir Agrawal (2/19) and Hayden Ou (1/13) responded to the call with accurate and economical opening spells, with Agrawal starting with consecutive maidens, and Ou conceding only 13 runs in his allotted six overs! However, Grammar still got off to a strong start, reaching o-67 by capitalising on loose bowling after the opening spells. A double wicket over by Supan Arudselvan (2-25) subsequently triggered a collapse, as Grammar lost 4 wickets for just 8 runs. Unfortunately we were unable to maintain the pressure, and Grammar got away to 189 all out. It was a much improved bowling performance, with Andrew Wu topping the wickets table again with 3-41, and Aashray Narula also contributing with two wickets. Chasing a stiff total, High lost regular wickets due to sloppy running and poor shot selection. Shreyas Pulapaka provided a useful innings of 27; however when he departed to a loose shot, hopes faded of a competitive match. Overall there were plenty of positives despite the heavy defeat, and if High can fine tune their batting technique and cut out silly errors, there remains plenty of hope for some wins this season.

27 October 2012

Kings won the toss and batted first, and made full use of a beautiful day and a belter of a pitch to score 304 runs in their allotted overs. Andrew Wu played a lone hand in trying to hold them back, taking 2-37 from his 6 overs. When batting, High made a reasonably promising start after the loss of an early wicket. Supan Arudselvan (19), Shreyas Pulapaka (12) and Kabir Agrawal (15) each got off to decent starts only to throw their wickets away recklessly. **15 B's - HIGH 7/96 (20)** (S. Arudselvan 31, S. Shringapure 18\*, Y. Zhou 10\*) defeated by **Newington 4/101 (14)** (K. Agrawal 2/17)

Winning the toss and electing to bat, the innings started badly, losing Rick Saha off the first ball. However, the innings was largely recused due to a swashbuckling and prototypical T20 innings from opener Supan Arudselvan. Supan showed fearless determination in mercilessly dispatching the high quality Newington bowling attack to all corners of the field, including a magnificent six over point, drawing comparisons from spectators and players alike to the little master, Sachin Tendulkar AO. A number of middle order batsmen contributed to Supan's innings, accumulating the score to just under 50 at drinks. Unfortunately, with the fall of Supan, the innings slowed while the wickets increased in regularity. Sahil Shringapure and Yilun Zhou mounted a prosperous rear guard action in the last 5 overs however, to lift the scoring rate significantly and take advantage of some wayward Newington bowling. The second innings had an inauspicious start, with 12 being taken from the first over. Kabir Agrawal sought to quickly rectify this by completing a neat maiden with a wicket off the final ball. With another two wickets in the next two overs, things were tipping to High's favour, Newington struggling at 3/18. Newington were able to come back from this setback however, putting together an impressive 60 run stand. From here, Newington never looked back. Despite losing another wicket, they cruised to victory in the 14th over, with only minimal resistance from High.

13 October 2012

**15 B's - HIGH 6/116 (20)** (S. Pulapaka 43, A. Narula 19\*, S. Shringapure 16, A. Mao 10) defeated by **St Joseph's 6/117 (17.3)** (S. Shringapure 2/25)

Sydney High batted first, and after a slow start opened up to reach 1-35 after 7 overs, with Salil Shringapure scoring 16. A mini-collapse followed, and we were worried at 4-45 after 10. However, a good partnership between Shreyas Pulapaka (43) and Aashray Narula (19 not out), and a quickfire cameo from Alexander Mao (10) lifted the total to 116 after 20 overs. Regular wickets kept us in the hunt during Joeys' innings, with Salil Shringapure taking 2-25, and Shreyas Pulapaka, Aashray Narula, Kabir Agrawal, and Hayden Ou taking one wicket each. Ultimately multiple dropped catches cost us in a relatively tight finish. A good first round performance from the boys.
